

Bible: Isaac's son, Jacob, has trouble being honest, but God is still with him.

**Language**: In Phonics we are reading and writing short o words. In Grammar, we are reviewing nouns. In Writing, we are developing ideas into short stories.

Creation Studies: Reviewing daily and seasonal changes and learning about Remembrance Day

**Reading**: For reading, students are working on reading strategies that will help them become better readers, such as identifying word endings, looking at parts of words, compound words and identifying "secret stories" in order to read unknown words. Also, students continue to work on identifying key events of a story.

**Writing**: Students continue to grow their ability to write a sequence of events by using transitional words (first, then, next, last) and editing their writing by thinking about "What does a sentence need?"

**Spelling**: In lesson 9, students will be working on the long vowel u (rule, use, tune, mile, due, true, grew, few, you, cute, knew, threw, clue, tube, huge). The spelling test will be on Friday.

**Math**: For Math, students will continue growing their ability to count money accurately and write the amount in cents and dollars.

**Science**: Next week, students will continue learning about the different states of matter. We will be doing an activity that will allow students to explore the three different states of matter and make a connection with our triune God.

**Bible**: Next week, we will continue learning about who God is. Students will learn the story of Joseph. The students will understand that all things work for the good of those who love the Lord. The memory verse is Psalm 32:1, "Blessed is the one whose transgression is forgiven, whose sin is covered." Students will recite the memory verse on Friday.

### **Grade 3 News & Learning Update**

What a way to wrap our unit on owls and wisdom this week! The children really enjoyed seeing the owls in real life and learning about them.





### Spotlight on Learning: Beyond the Grade

This week I saw something that made my heart hurt: a few students felt a lot of pressure during a math test. They were very worried about the grade they would get on the test.

### What the research says (in plain language)

- When rewards and punishments drive learning, intrinsic motivation drops. Decades of research
  in Self-Determination Theory shows that heavy external control (like chasing grades) can erode
  students' inner desire to learn.
- **Pressure fuels dishonesty.** Reviews of academic cheating link it to stress, high-stakes evaluation, and appearance/performance goals (looking "smart" vs. getting better).
- Parental pressure and constant monitoring raise anxiety without improving learning. Studies
  associate perceived pressure with higher stress and anxiety in students; even well-meaning grade
  checking can heighten strain.
- Focusing on learning (not just points) improves persistence. Mindset research suggests that framing challenges as opportunities to grow supports resilience and reduces shortcuts.
- Even business/education leaders warn that "grades first" blocks real learning. Shifting attention from points to mastery helps students engage for the right reasons. <u>Harvard Business School</u>

### What we're doing in class

- Clear success criteria & feedback: Students see exactly what "good" looks like and get specific next steps (not just a number).
- Retakes/revisions with reflection: If a concept isn't secure, students can try again after practice—because the goal is mastery.
- **Learning conversations:** We celebrate strategies used, questions asked, and growth shown—on paper and in person.
- **Integrity routines:** We talk about honesty as part of character and faith, and we practice "show your thinking" habits that make cheating unnecessary.

### How you can help at home (simple swaps)

- Swap "What grade did you get?" for "What did you learn today? What part was tricky?"
- Praise the process, not just the product: "I noticed you planned your answer," "You stuck with it."
   (Process praise supports resilience.)
- **Set calm expectations:** Consequences tied strictly to grades increase fear; encouragement tied to effort, strategy, and improvement builds courage.
- **Limit constant grade-checking apps:** Periodic reviews are fine; continual monitoring can spike anxiety.
- **Partner with me on goals:** If your child is worried about a mark, let's make a small, specific plan (targeted practice + a chance to show growth).

Bottom line: When we shift attention from the number to the learning, students feel safer, work more honest	у,
and grow more deeply. I'm committed to that kind of classroom—and I'm grateful to partner with you in it.

Thank you to those parents who took the time to meet with me this past week. If last week did not work out and you would like to meet, do not hesitate to reach out to me by Dojo or email. Here's what we are up to next week:

- **Math**: We have started our unit on geometry. In this unit, we will learn the attributes of shapes, how to transform shapes, enlargements, reductions, and dilations.
- Language: We are working on paragraph writing. This week's focus is creating descriptive paragraphs. We are finishing up our book with a project due next week and a quiz the following week. We are planning to start our next book next week. Today students were given their new spelling words. We will be using Spelling Workout and will have a test on Lesson 9 words next week Thursday (7th).
