We've had a good week! We are settling in nicely and have had some great success in our work. We are learning how to build stamina in our independent work, writing, and many other areas! Each week we will be talking about a new word that will help us be better friends, students, and followers of God. This past week our word was SMILE. We tried to make others smile and thanked God for things that make us smile. Next week's word is STAMINA.

We are excited to run Terry Fox laps at morning recess and have contributed many laps towards our class average.

**Bible:** God created the world and he thought it was Very Good! Our chapel word of the week is B is for Branches.

**Language:** We are reviewing Medial (middle) and Final consonant sounds. We are learning to create and recognize Common Nouns and we are using our sounding out abilities to write words.

**Spelling:** List 2: to, in, is, you, going, give, man, can, ran, pan. Bonus Word: Ms. Stam. Spelling Tests are on Friday mornings.

**Math:** We are learning about Tally marks, reviewing numbers up to 20, plus learning about odd and even numbers.

Creation Studies: God created our Amazing Bodies.



### Mrs. Febo

The second week of school has gone amazingly well. Students have been working diligently and are excited about their learning.

**Reading**: Students will learn that when we read, we need to use rhythm and expression. Students will also be working on identifying beginning and ending consonant sounds.

**Spelling**: Lesson 2- Differentiating between consonants and vowels (let, his, had, ask, old, took, also, sat, fell, get, look, cold, blue, ship, and mask). The spelling test will be on Friday.

**Writing**: Students will be working on utilizing proper letter formation (top to bottom) and utilizing proper spaces between words by creating "I see..." sentences. Students will also work on extending their sentences by using descriptive words to describe what they see.

**Math**: Students will continue developing their Number Sense by using ones, tens and hundreds blocks to count and represent numbers. We are working on understanding what the ones, tens and hundreds place represent.

**Social Studies**: Students will continue learning about "Families and Traditions". Students will learn what traditions are and identify what traditions they have in their families. For homework, students will be completing an interview that allows them to learn more about their families' stories. Students will also complete their family tree at home so that they can create a poster in class.

**Bible**: Students will continue learning about principles and values that are found in the Bible that should guide our way of living. Next week, students will learn about "forgiveness". Students will learn about what the bible says about forgiveness in Ephesians 4:32 and in Matthew 18:21-22.

**Art**: Next week, students will begin decorating their art folders. Students will do so by creating a collage. Students should begin collecting pictures from magazines that they like or that they can relate to. They should have sufficient pictures to cover their art folder. It is quite big. My suggestion is 20 pictures at least. This will be due on Friday.

### grade 3 News & Learning Update

It was another exciting week in Grade Three!

We are continuing to work on routines this week and build in some stamina for working for longer periods of time. I have also added in some beginning curriculum to help build those routines. I heard that when asked how Grade 3 is, a student replied, "She is strict!" That's true but I am also sure that as the students learn the routines, things will feel a little less arduous.



### Why We're Mastering Ten

At the start of each school year, I often hear the same question:

"Why are we doing this baby work in math?"

Right now, we're focusing on the "**Making Ten**" strategy. Yes, many of the children already know how to add single-digit numbers from memory. But here's why we begin this way:

### 1. Building Confidence

Since most students are comfortable with smaller numbers, they can check their answers with success. Getting answers right builds confidence—and confidence builds perseverance when the numbers get bigger and more challenging.

### 2. Learning How to Record Work

How we write down our "proofs" matters. You may remember teachers in high school who took off marks if you skipped a step in your work. I explain to students that mathematicians record their thinking in clear ways so others can follow along. (And yes, they're a little lazy—LOL!—so they like to do it in simple, efficient ways.)

### 3. Understanding the Base Ten System

Many students don't fully realize how our number system is built, or why it's so efficient. Working with ten helps them see the patterns and relationships between numbers and equations. This understanding is the foundation for mastering more complex math skills. After all, our entire number system is designed around ten—it's meant to make math easier!

#### 4. Building Mental Recall for Later

While single-digit facts may already be quick and automatic, later we'll be working with two- and three-digit numbers. My goal is for students to develop the same fast, automatic responses with larger equations. Starting with "Making Ten" is like practicing scales in music—it lays the groundwork for more advanced fluency later.

**Math**: Rounding whole numbers and decimals. There will be a final test on our Whole Numbers unit on Tuesday, September 23rd


Writing: We will be working on grammar, specifically simple subjects and simple predicates

### **Greetings Grade 5 Parents,**

Our second week of school has gone quite well and the students are definitely getting into their class routines and improving at following classroom rules and expectations.

You may have noticed that there was a field trip permission form sent home yesterday which included information about an upcoming trip to Black Creek Pioneer Village. The total cost for your child to attend is \$41 which includes the bus and entrance fee. The permission form and payment is due by this Monday, September 15<sup>th</sup>. The payment can either be made in cash along with the permission form on Monday or you can pay Ms. Rossi directly within the school office by Visa/Debit. This field trip should be a very enjoyable day and it will strengthen the students' understanding of the Social Studies curriculum.

Here's a look at what we will be studying in each subject during this upcoming week:

**Bible:** We will continue our study of the Old Testament stories by looking at The Tower of Babel and will also begin looking at the Life of Abraham. Our Bible verse for this week will be Philippians 3: 20-21, and our written quiz on this Bible verse will be on Friday.

**Math:** For this upcoming week we will look at subtracting whole numbers and then move on too adding and subtracting decimals. At the end of the week we will start to introduce multiplication and division.

**Science:** This week we will be starting our study of the respiratory system and will look at the parts of our respiratory system and their functions. We will also look at how the process of "breathing in" works.

Bible: We will explore the topic "What Does Real Love Look Like?"

**Memory Verse:** *Philippians 3:20* – "But our citizenship is in heaven. And we eagerly await a Savior from there, the Lord Jesus Christ."

**Mathematics:** Our Number Sense unit continues. Students will work on square roots, exponents, rational and irrational numbers, and converting between fractions, decimals, and percentages.

**Language:** Spelling and Vocabulary List # 3 – focusing on word meanings and parts of speech, including adverbs, prepositions, interjections, and conjunctions. Students will also develop ideas for narrative writing.

**Science:** We will continue our Cells unit, comparing plant and animal cells, learning to use and label the microscope, and exploring diffusion and osmosis. **Cell models are due September 15th** and will be presented in class.

**History:** We are continuing our unit on Confederation in Canada. This week we will learn about how the four colonies joined together and what the status of the other British colonies caused disagreements.

Art: Students will continue creating their inspirational Bible verse posters.

## French

### Mme. Kang

This week we began our new units as listed below. Next week students will be learning to use key vocabulary in context during class. For homework, students in grades 4 through 8 are encouraged to spend fifteen minutes, three times a week, listening to French, reviewing vocabulary, or completing work left unfinished from class. If you are looking for something to do this weekend, Francophonie en Fête (Toronto's Francophone Festival) is at the Bentway, 250 Fort York Boulevard. With family-friendly activities and concerts, there is something for everyone to enjoy. Please see the posters below for details.

- **Grade 8** *J'achète...ou pas? (On my screen)* Students will review reading strategies such as looking for familiar words and using the context to help them understand new vocabulary while reading radio jingles. The grammar focus is reviewing how to construct the *passé composé* with the verb *avoir*.
- **Grade 7** *Je veux, je peux (I want, I can)* Students are learning vocabulary to describe their hobbies and interests. We will review expressions that use the verb *avoir*.
- **Grade 6** *Mon Canada (My Canada)* Students have been learning vocabulary about common Canadian symbols. They will be making connections between symbols and parts of Canada. Students will learn expressions that use the verb *avoir*.
- **Grade 5** *Prends soin de moi* Students will review animal names and learn the names of their habitats. Key vocabulary includes adjectives describing animals. Students will review the verb *avoir*.
- **Grade 4** *Je parle français (I speak French)* Our target language is verbs and phrases associated with our responsibilities at home and at school. We will be using the verb 'avoir' in context.
- **Grade 3** *Un crayon* We will be reading a story about Max and his crayon, reviewing vocabulary for school supplies. We will be using the verb 'avoir' in context.
- **Grade 2** We will be noticing the sounds of several consonants (**p**, **b**, **t/th**) as we read about colours and school adventures. We continue to review the calendar and weather vocabulary.
- **Grade 1** We are using the Accelerative Integrated Methodology that uses gestures and sign language to learn new vocabulary. Next week we practice giving and following directions. We continue to review consonant sounds and colours.
- **Kindergarten** We are using the Accelerative Integrated Methodology that uses gestures and sign language to learn new vocabulary. This week students practiced greeting one another. We continue to review consonant sounds and colours.
