Math: We will begin Chapter 6: "Solids, Shapes, and Equal Parts."



Everyday we have more Christmas decorations up in our classroom and we are very excited to talk and learn about Christmas.

We continue to practice noticing the good things in people and the joyful things around us. We are continuing to talk about how to talk through problems with people using tact, rather than yelling.

Bible: God saves Moses and uses him to save the Israelites, plus we're learning the Christmas Story. Our chapel word for the week is H is for Helper.

Language: Reading and writing long 'a' words like cake and rain. We are learning more about verbs, plus we're reading and writing about Christmas.

Spelling: their, if, will, up, old, once, cut, nut, hut, shut, Challenge Words: butter, peanut.

Math: We are learning about coins and their value, plus we are learning how to count multiples and combinations of coins.

Creation Studies: Our Local Community and how we can help make a difference.

Reading: For reading, students are working on reading strategies that will help them become better readers, such as identifying word endings. Next week, we are focusing on the endings -ed and -ing. Students are beginning to understand what a base word is.

Writing: Students will continue learning about writing letters. Next week, students will write an introductory letter to our elf on the shelf.

Spelling: In lesson 13, students will be working on blends with I and r (grass, trunk, truck, flew, flat, class, plate, from, glove, friend, growl, fresh, plan, blanket, crown). The spelling test will be on Friday.

Math: For Math, students will continue learning about time. Students will continue working on elapsed time (How much time has passed?). Please continue to practice telling time at home by asking students to tell time and ask questions. Here are some questions. What time is it? What time will it be in 1 hour (2 hours, 5 hours, 30 minutes)? How much time has passed since 6 o'clock?

Science: Next week, students will continue learning about the words absorb, dissolve, buoyancy, and repel. Students will carry out an experiment that will allow them to understand the word dissolve.

Bible: Next week, we will begin learning about the Christmas story. The memory verse is Ephesians 5:1, "Be imitators of God as beloved children." Students will recite the memory verse on Friday.

Friendly reminders...

- -Nathaniel will be celebrating his birthday with his friends at school on Tuesday, December 2nd. He will be bringing pizza and cupcakes to celebrate.

- -A Reading Fluency Passage will be provided every week. These short passages provide students with a simple and accessible way to grow in their reading fluency. The goal is for students to read the passage in one minute. Every week, the number of words or the length of the words will change. This will challenge students little by little, as they continue to grow in their reading.

It was a pretty exciting day in Grade 3 as we got "rescued" from our deserted islands and the Grinch parachuted in. He is promising to be pretty mischievous over the next 3 weeks before the Christmas holidays! He brought Max with him! Poor Max, landed on the window blinds as he was without a parachute! I know the children are building excitement and we will keep the beauty of the birth of Jesus always in mind as we also enjoy some fun activities.

This Week in Grade 3

This week we explored the idea that **memorizing is just one small piece of the learning puzzle**. While memorization helps students recall facts, research from cognitive science shows that students remember **far more when they regularly retrieve information and explain it in their own words**, rather than relying only on rereading or memorizing (Roediger & Karpicke, 2006).

We also talked about **Bloom's Taxonomy**, a framework teachers use to guide deep learning. Memorization sits at the bottom level ("Remember"), while strong learners grow by moving upward — **understanding**, **applying**, **analyzing**, **evaluating**, **and creating**. Our classroom activities are designed to help students climb toward those higher levels, where real thinking and problem-solving happen.

To help students build a fuller toolbox of learning approaches, we've been practising several evidence-based strategies in class:

- Retrieval practice recalling information without looking at notes
- **Explaining thinking** putting ideas into their own words
- Spacing and review revisiting a concept over several days
- Making connections linking new ideas to personal experiences

- Using visuals diagrams, models, and drawings
- **Applying learning** solving problems or creating something new with the information

You can help reinforce these skills at home in simple, natural ways:

- Ask your child to teach you something they learned today.
- Encourage them to **draw or model** an idea visually.
- Revisit learning in brief conversations: "What do you remember about...?"
- Help them make connections to everyday life cooking, nature, books, or routines.

For parents who enjoy learning more about how children think, this short article is clear and helpful:

These small practices help children move from "Do I remember this?" to "Do I understand this, and can I use it?" — the heart of deeper learning.

Greetings Grade 5 Parents,

We look forward to another exciting week of learning for the week of December 1-5. As we get closer to the Christmas holidays things can sometimes become a little chaotic. If it's necessary, I will be spending time in class to review our classroom rules and expectations with the students.

Here's a look at what we will be studying in each subject during this upcoming week:

Bible: During this upcoming week we will look at how God guided Israel during their wilderness wanderings and the story of the twelve spies who scouted out the land of Canaan. Throughout the week we will practice our Bible verse which is 1 Corinthians 12: 26-27. This memory verse will be introduced to the students on Monday and the quiz will be the following Monday (December 8th).

Math: For this week we will continue with our data literacy unit by looking at infographics, mean, median and mode, and analyzing graphs.

Social Studies: For this week we will conclude our study of local governments by looking at municipal councils, band councils, and communication with citizens as it pertains to local government. By the end of the week we will start looking at Provincial and Territorial governments.

Spelling: The new list of spelling words for this week will look at words with <u>en, im</u>, or <u>mis</u>. These spelling words will be introduced to the students on Monday and the spelling quiz for these words will be the following Monday (December 8th). The spelling words are as follows:

Writing: For the coming week the students will continue to write their persuasive paragraphs.

Reading: For this week we will continue our novel study by working through the reading and comprehension questions for Chapter 22 from "Danny Champion of the World" by Roald Dahl. This is the final chapter of our novel study and for the remainder of the week we will begin reading short stories from "Mountain Pathways" and completing comprehension questions.

Art: For this week the students will complete their Henri Matisse "flowers" art project which incorporates the art design principles of shape and color.

Our next unit will focus on **Patterns and Relationships**, beginning with identifying and describing repeating and growing patterns, including patterns found in real-life situations.

Here's what we are up to next week:

- **Math**: We are continuing to work on fractions and decimals. This unit includes operations with both of these as well using order of operations, rounding, and using percentages.
- Language: We are working on our first major writing assignment a narrative We are also reading, The Five People You Meet in Heaven. Today students were given their new spelling words. We will be using Spelling Workout and will have a test on Lesson 12 words next week Friday (5th).
- **History**: This week we will have a short project based on the Loyalists and the War of 1812 to review for the upcoming test on the 4th. We will also start the next chapter which focuses on how Canada transforms after the War and how it learns to be more independent.
- **Science**: This week, we will examine how external forces act on object, learn to interpret force diagrams, and clarify the difference between mass and weight.

- Art: We are finishing up Superhero art and starting two point perspective art.

Bible: We will finalize their service projects and begin preparing presentations that highlight the importance of giving. Their presentations should explain why they selected their specific project and how it demonstrates Christ-like love in action.

Memory Verse - Ephesians 5:1-2

Language: Students will review subject-verb agreement and common homophones. We will continue reading Inventing Elliot (Chapters 15 and 16) and complete Spelling Lesson #13 in preparation for Friday's Spelling and Definition Test.

History: This week we will look at the Indian Act, Residential Schooling, and how First Nations dealt and are dealing with their position in Canada.

Science: Our learning will focus on different types of energy, along with an exploration of contact and non-contact forces.

Visual Arts: Students will continue developing their perspective drawings.
